

## Institutional Profile Summary

**Institution type:** Land-grant research university; Carnegie Classification: doctoral research university with very high research activity.

**Location:** Multi-campus university with flagship campus in Pullman, Washington, a co-located campus in Spokane, regional campuses in the Tri-Cities and Vancouver, Washington, and 64 research, extension, and learning center locations throughout the state.

**Governance Structure:** Washington State University is governed by an independent 10-member Board of Regents appointed for six-year terms by the Governor of the state of Washington.

**Budget:** Annual operating budget of \$523 million; annual capital budget expenditures of \$90 million; endowment value of \$263.3 million as of June 30, 2006, excluding value of land-grant assets; federal grant expenditures in excess of \$92.6 million per year; total research and public service expenditures in excess of \$242 million per year (FY06).

**Enrollment:** The Pullman campus serves more than 18,400 undergraduate and graduate students; Spokane serves 1,580; Tri-Cities 1,096; and Vancouver 2,329. Statewide, WSU enrolls more than 23,000 students. This figure includes students enrolled through the Center for Distance and Professional Education. Washington State University students come from all over the world, representing 104 countries and all 50 states.

**Faculty and Staff:** More than 1,300 instructional faculty members, including several who have achieved the country's highest honor for scientists and engineers as members of either the National Academy of Sciences or the National Academy of Engineering; more than 3,500 classified and professional staff.

**Athletics:** Member of the Pac-10 Conference and NCAA Division I; 453 student-athletes participate on 7 men's and 10 women's intercollegiate athletics teams, including football, baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's track and cross-country, women's volleyball, women's soccer, and women's crew.
